MARK YOUR CALENDAR

This is your official 10-day challenge! You can do the 10 days right in a row, or take 3 weeks to move through the list only on the weekdays.



DAY 1

Print this packet. Look over the App list and find 5 to download, for yourself or your kids, to start learning right away!

DAY 2

Read the article on Language Learning. Write down your family learning goals. If possible, share them with someone else.

DAY 3

Browse my podcast suggestions. Choose 2-3 for your and/or your kids to listen to regularly.

DAY 4

Post our language posters, to give you some everyday phrases and remind you to speak Spanish together!

DAY 5

Look over my suggestions for music. Choose 2-3 CDs or Spotify playlists to buy or have ready.

DAY 6

Browse the book lists. Make an order from your local library or buy a few to keep close by for bedtime stories.

DAY 7

Consider if you want a "curriculum" or just use the resources here. Spend some time looking through your options!

DAY 8

Set up a language notebook with your kids to keep everyone organized with their Spanish learning!

DAY 9

Make a schedule for learning Spanish. Try for something realistic, and possibly attach it to another regular activity.

DAY 10

Join our Facebook Group "Teach Your Kids Spanish," to stay motivated, ask questions, and find support!



CHALLENGE 101

This 10-day challenge will guide you to readying your Spanglish home and getting your Spanish learning goals off the ground. No more overwhelm from all the resources "out there"! Sample the best of podcasts, books, apps, and more, and discover what works for you. No more false starts when you have what you need on hand and a plan to use it!

WHY IT MATTERS

Many families stall out on learning Spanish before it becomes a habit. They get overwhelmed or jump in without preparing first. Take the time to complete each step, so you're armed with an actionable plan and have your resources ready to go.

HOW TO CHOOSE

Some of you can barely remember your high school Spanish! Others are fluent but need help getting their kids started. As I suggest Podcasts or Apps, **choose what you like**, and what fits your level. Go ahead and **commit** to a few you like, to keep moving forward.

HOW TO SCHEDULE

You'll see prompts for scheduling your learning time. You can create a personal routine, and one for your kids, or the whole family together. You can choose a time of day, certain days of the week, or attach it to a routine like bedtime.

COST OF RESOURCES

I include recommendations for both free and paid resources. There should be something for every budget here. Access to a printer will be beneficial to use the resources within this eBook. But you can choose to invest in more materials, or simply rely on the free options.

TIPS FOR LEARNING A NEW LANGUAGE

If you are a fluent Spanish speaker, teaching your kids can be very natural. Talk together and tell stories! If you aren't a fluent speaker, you'll be learning together. Keep a step ahead and look for resources to use together. Each situation is unique. Whatever language you can learn together is a gift!

BE REALISTIC

Studying a language for a few hours a week has *amazing* benefits. However, don't be discouraged if you aren't speaking fluently after a year. It simply takes time. Also keep in mind that comprehension through listening and reading will always be ahead of speaking abilities. Encourage them to speak when they are ready.

Stay inspired with big dreams, but also be patient and realize this is a long-term goal!

COMPREHENSION > IMMERSION

Does it surprise you I said that? Okay, so immersion is awesome in certain contexts (like when you have hours of language exposure every day). But the quickest way to learn Spanish is hearing language we understand. Immersion that sounds like noise isn't a great use of lesson time! (It's also why just turning on Netflix cartoons in Spanish for an hour every day won't work as a stand-alone language plan.)

Start with words and phrases, and slowly add in more. Use visuals and gestures to keep everything comprehensible.

LEARN SONGS

Music is your best friend when learning Spanish! If you aren't a native speaker, it's a perfect way to work on pronunciation together. Listen to lots of songs together.

MOVE AND TOUCH

Attach movements and gestures to new words and phrases when you can. This is especially important with little ones.

It's always extra engaging and memorable when you can use real objects and hands-on activities. Play is key to learning with kids a well.

5

USE GAMES

Games are highly engaging and always make learning extra fun. See my page on language game ideas to find something for every age.

6

FOLLOW INTERESTS

You'll have the most long-term success if you tailor your activities to what your children enjoy. Are they competitive? Social? Wiggly? Artistic? This can guide how long your "lessons" are, and what themes/curriculum/classes you choose.

7

ALWAYS REVIEW

Work review into EVERY lesson. We have to hear language many times in different contexts to retain it long-term!

Language in context is always the best language. Try to start with short phrases, and work your way to stories and conversation.
